- 8 The Globe Theatre burned to the ground after catching fire during a performance of this play.
- 9 The English playwright known for "The Spanish Tragedy".
- 10 "..... the Great": a play by Christopher Marlowe.
- 11 Part One of this play is thought to have been the first play written by William Shakespeare.
- 12 This Shakespeare play is also known as The Scottish Play.
- 13 This man, who was Earl of Oxford, is put forward by some as being the true author of the works attributed to William Shakespeare.
