- 1 An Elizabethan actor who was also the founder of Dulwich College.
- 2 This theatre was built in 1599 by Shakespeare's company, the Lord Chamberlain's Men.
- 3 Actor, theatre owner, entrepreneur, artist and friend of William Shakespeare. Richard
- 4 The theatre built by Philip Henslowe in Bankside in 1587.
- 5 The playwright responsible for "Doctor Faustus" among others.
- 6 A theatre built by Philip Henslowe and Jacob Meade in 1613/14 in Bankside.
- 7 A man from Stratford-upon-Avon who wrote many famous plays and sonnets and who is known as The Bard.
- 8 The Globe Theatre burned to the ground after catching fire during a performance of this play.
- 9 The English playwright known for "The Spanish Tragedy".
- 10 "..... the Great": a play by Christopher Marlowe.
- 11 Part One of this play is thought to have been the first play written by William Shakespeare.
- 12 This Shakespeare play is also known as The Scottish Play.
- 13 This man, who was Earl of Oxford, is put forward by some as being the true author of the works attributed to William Shakespeare.
- 14 Elizabethan poet and playwright who wrote "The Battle of Alcazar" (1594) and "David and Bethsabe" (1599) amongst others.
