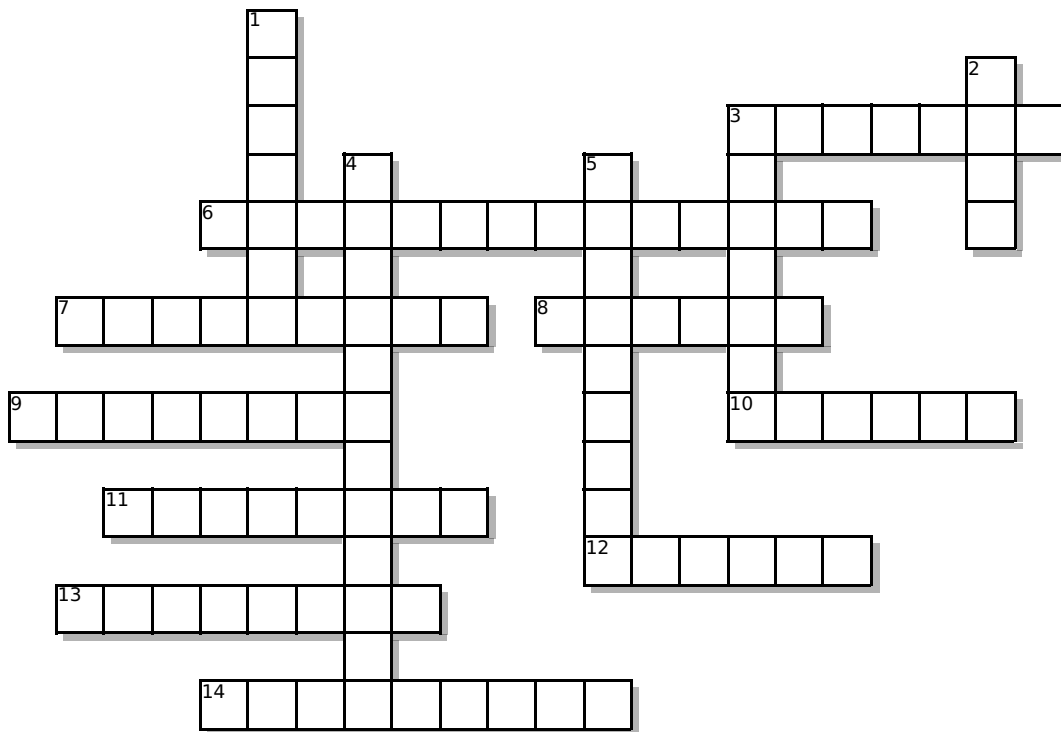


Ladies-in-waiting



ACROSS

- 3 This Margery served Queens Catherine of Aragon, Anne Boleyn and Jane Seymour, and was Jane Seymour's Keeper of the Queen's Jewels.
- 6 This daughter of Mary Boleyn served Queen Elizabeth I faithfully for many years.
- 7 Maiden name of Jane Dudley, Duchess of Northumberland, who served Anne of Cleves.
- 8 Maiden name of the Jane executed with her mistress, Queen Catherine Howard, in February 1542.
- 9 This Bess was Countess of Shrewsbury and a lady-in-waiting to Elizabeth I.
- 10 This Agnes served Catherine of Aragon and was the second wife of Thomas Howard, 2nd Duke of Norfolk.
- 11 This Anne served Elizabeth I as a maid-of-honour and was the mistress of Edward de Vere, 17th Earl of Oxford, and Sir Henry Lee.
- 12 This Mary was scarred severely after nursing the queen through smallpox in 1562.
- 13 This Elizabeth served Queen Catherine Parr and gave an eyewitness account of the Dowager Queen's final hours in September 1548.

- 14 Maiden name of Lady Anne Zouche, the lady-in-waiting who borrowed Anne Boleyn's copy of William Tyndale's "The Obedience of a Christian Men". Her fiancé, George Zouche, stole it from her and it got into Cardinal Wolsey's hands.

- 1 This Bess served Anne Boleyn and Jane Seymour and was the mistress of Thomas Howard, 3rd Duke of Norfolk.
- 2 First name of the four girls (surnames: Beaton, Seton, Livingston and Fleming) appointed by Marie de Guise to be companions and ladies-in-waiting to her daughter, Mary, Queen of Scots.
- 3 Elizabeth I was served by two ladies named Blanche, Blanche Parry and her aunt, Blanche, Lady Troy.
- 4 This Bess was a lady-in-waiting to Elizabeth I, was married to Sir Walter Raleigh and, according to legend, carried her husband's embalmed head around with her.
- 5 The Maria who came to England with her mistress, Catherine of Aragon, and whose daughter married Charles Brandon, Duke of Suffolk.
