
Wars of the Roses and Tudor Battles Puzzle



ACROSS

- 3 This battle was one of the main battles of the Prayer Book Rebellion and took place on 17 August 1549.
- 5 England was defeated by Scotland at this battle on 27 February 1545.
- 6 Queen Margaret of Anjou's forces were victorious were victorious against the Yorkists at this battle on 30 December 1460.
- 8 This battle on 29 March 1461 is said to be the most barbaric battle ever fought on English soil.
- 9 The Duke of Somerset's forces were victorious against the Scots at this battle on 10 September 1547.
- 10 Who was victorious at the Battle of Blore Heath on 23 September 1459: the Lancastrians or Yorkists?
- 14 This battle on 17 June 1497 ended the Cornish Rebellion and is also known as the Battle of Deptford Bridge.
- 15 Richard Neville, Earl of Warwick, defeated Edward IV's forces at this battle on 26 July 1469.
- 16 The first pitched battle of the Wars of the Roses took place here on 22 May 1455.
- 18 This battle on 27 August 1549 ended Kett's

Rebellion in East Anglia.

DOWN

- 1 This battle took place on 14 April 1471 and Edward IV was victorious against Richard Neville, Earl of Warwick.
- 2 Richard III was killed at this battle on 22 August 1485.
- 4 This battle on 2 February 1461 saw the forces of Edward, Duke of York, victorious over forces led by Jasper Tudor and his father, Owen Tudor.
- 7 James IV was killed at this battle between England and Scotland on 9 September 1513.
- 11 This famous battle on 4 May 1471 saw the death of Edward, Prince of Wales, and was followed by the death of King Henry VI in the Tower of London.
- 12 This battle was fought between English forces and Irish forces, with Spanish help, on Christmas Eve 1601.
- 13 Lambert Simnel and the Earl of Lincoln were defeated by Henry VII's forces at this battle on 16 June 1487.
- 17 The Duke of Somerset, Lord Hungerford and Lord Roos were all executed following this battle, which took place on 15 May 1464.
