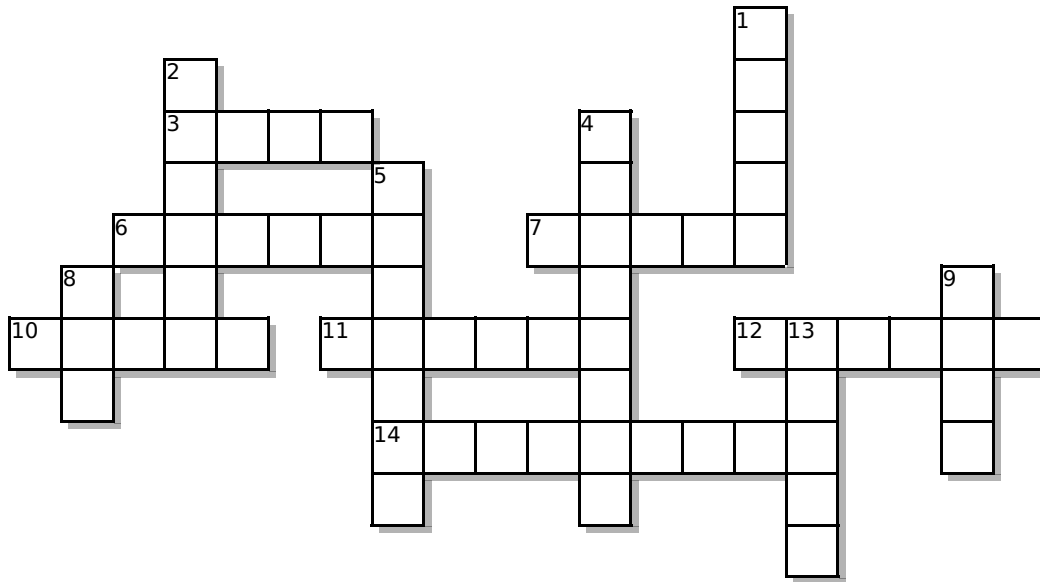


Medieval and Tudor Tools and Implements



ACROSS

- 3 A cutting tool similar to an axe and used for cutting slivers from the surface of a piece of wood.
- 6 Used instead of a scythe for small or awkward areas. Had a curved blade.
- 7 This wooden tool was used to separate grain from the husks. A metal version was used as a weapon.
- 10 Used by a blacksmith for shaping his work.
- 11 An ard was a light version of this agricultural tool, with a mouldboard being the heavier version.
- 12 An implement with wooden beams known as "bulls" used for breaking up soil and covering over seeds.
- 14 A basket was used to extract the corn from the outer husks.

DOWN

- 1 Tudor people used this type of pen for writing.
- 2 This type of knife was used for stripping animal skin in preparation for tanning.
- 4 A cutting tool with a sickle-shaped blade using for pruning.
- 5 Used by a blacksmith to control the temperature of a fire.
- 8 A pointed tool or spike used for piercing holes in materials like leather or wood.
- 9 Metal needles were new to England in the Tudor period. What were many needles made out of prior to this?
- 13 A drilling device.
