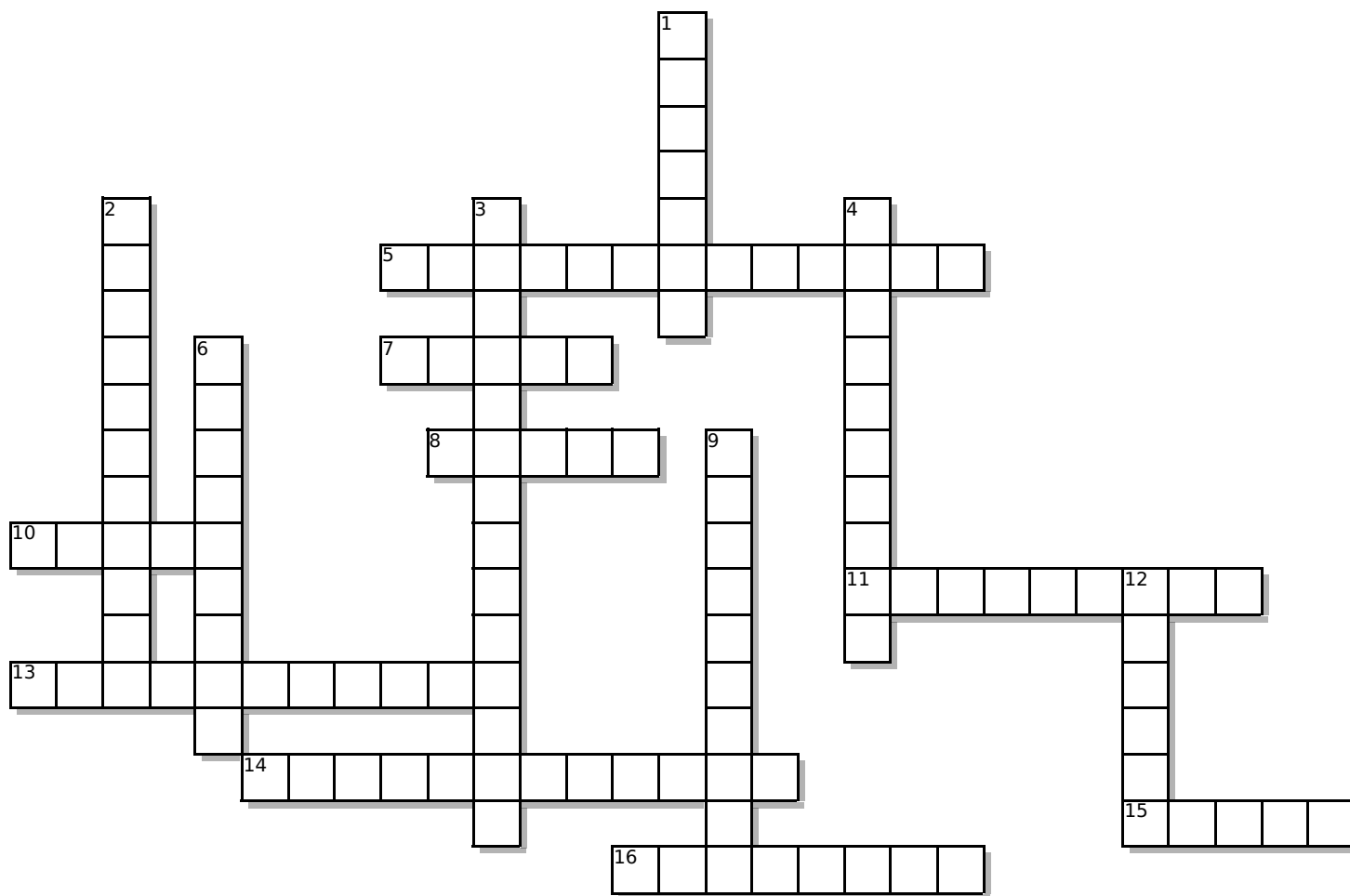


Witches and Witchcraft
