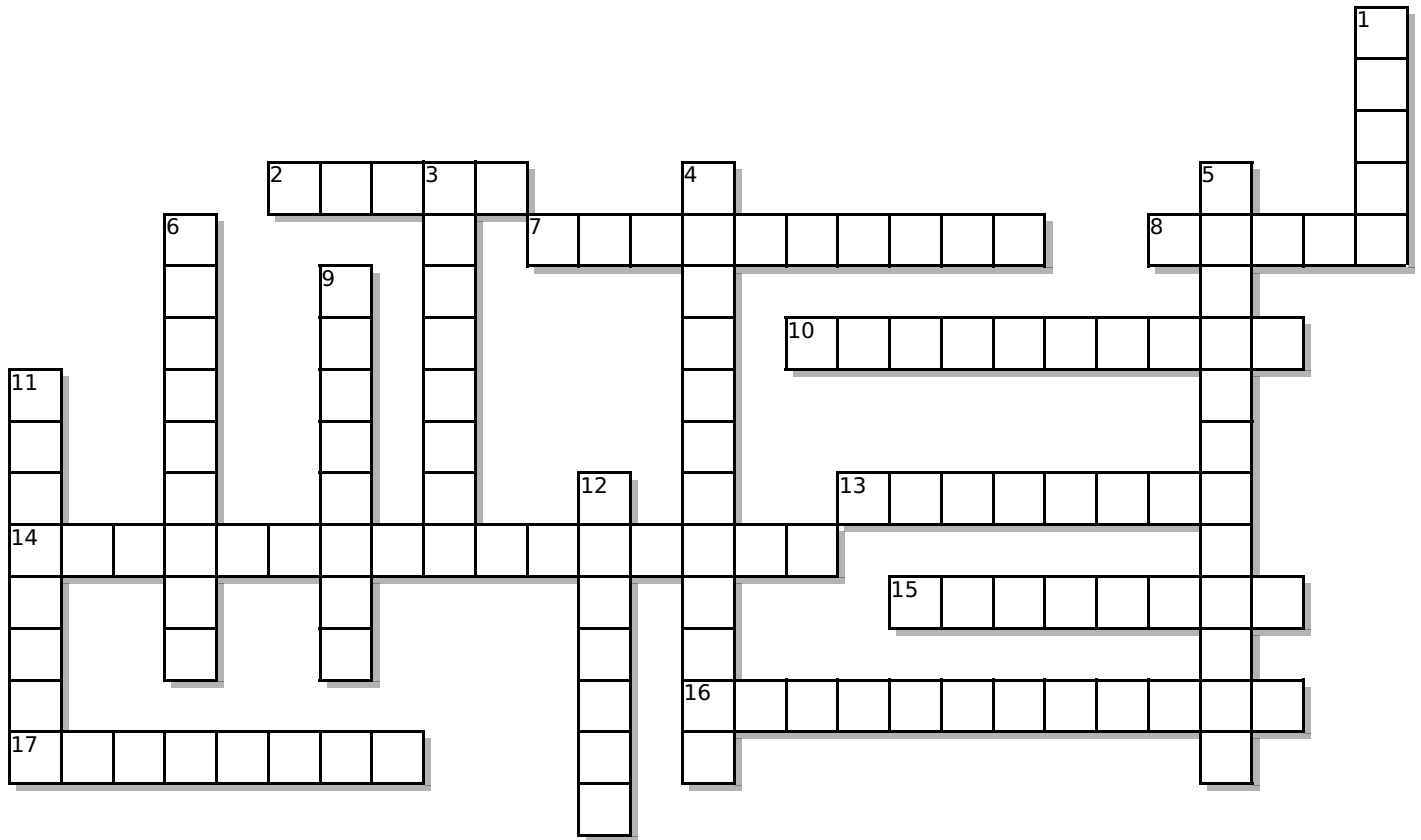


Lent Crossword Puzzle



ACROSS

- 2 These were traditionally burned to uses as ashes on Ash Wednesday.
- 7 The name of the three days before Lent.
- 8 Henry VIII gave permission for people to eat this during Lent because fish was so expensive.
- 10 According to the rules of St Thomas Aquinas, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday were, meaning that no food was eaten at all.
- 13 Made from flour, eggs and milk, these are traditionally enjoyed on Shrove Tuesday in the UK.
- 14 A bloodthirsty tradition enjoyed on Shrove Tuesday in Tudor times.
- 15 Shrove Tuesday took its name from this practice of confessing your sins to obtain absolution.
- 16 The first day of Lent.

- 17 This hid the chancel from the nave during Lent.

DOWN

- 1 Traditionally, Lent lasted for this many days (plus Sundays).
- 3 As well as fasting, people were prohibited from sexual relations and during Lent.
- 4 A day on which pieces of fried or roasted meat were traditionally enjoyed.
- 5 Lent lasted until this day.
- 6 An effigy made of straw and pelted during Lent.
- 9 Shrovetide was celebrated with this chivalric sport at the Tudor court.
- 11 A sport associated with Shrove Tuesday.
- 12 The word Lent comes from this Anglo-Saxon word meaning "spring".
