- 1 The Welsh for St David
- 2 The Welsh name for this flower is "Cenhinen Bedr" and it is a symbol of Wales
- 3 This was presented to Mary, daughter of Henry VIII, by yeomen of the guard on 1st March 1537, 1538 and 1544
- 4 Henry VII and Henry VIII paid for this for Welshmen at court on St David's Day
- 5 Henry VII was born in this Welsh town
- 6 Henry VII landed here in August 1485 when he returned from exile to claim the English throne
- 7 The Welsh soldier and landowner who helped Henry Tudor (VII) with his Bosworth campaign
- 8 This man was a Welsh courtier who married Catherine of Valois

- and who was the grandfather of Henry VII
- 9 Henry VII used this mythical creature from the badge of Cadwaladr in his standard at Bosworth in 1485
- 10 Princess Mary was sent here in 1525 to set up a household and to act as head of a new council
- 11 The Welsh captain in Shakespeare's "Henry V"
- 12 Henry VII was descended from the Tudors of Penmynydd of
- 13 Henry VII's father, Edmund Tudor, died at this Welsh castle in 1456
- 14 Henry VII lived at this castle with the Herberts when he was a child
- 15 The Welsh rebel who was executed in Henry VIII's reign in 1531
- 16 Edmund Tudor's remains were moved to this cathedral in the reign of Henry VIII

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
