- 1 The four weeks leading up to Christmas that were a time of fasting for Tudor people.
- 2 This tradition was associated with 6th December, the Feast of St Nicholas.
- 3 The Feast of the ...... is celebrated on 8th December.
- 4 This apostle, also known as Didymus, has his feast day on 21st December.
- 5 This was traditionally brought in by the men on the household on Christmas Eve.
- 6 The traditional time for taking down Christmas decorations in medieval and Tudor times.
- 7 The name of the day when people would start back at work after the Twelve Days of Christmas.
- 8 Elizabeth I ordered people to eat this for their Christmas Dinner to celebrate England's victory over the Armada because it was the first

- meal she ate after her navy had defeated Spain's ships.
- 9 A sweet made from milk, sugar and rose-water, which was cut into cubes.
- 10 This almond paste could be shaped into all kinds of things and decorated, and would often be the centrepiece of the sweet-meat course.
- 11 A drink made from mixing hot cider, sherry or ale, apples and spices.
- 12 This would traditionally contain thirteen ingredients, to symbolise lesus and his apostle.
- 13 This person would lead the entertainment and revelry over the festive season.
- 14 The enjoying of a communal cup of spiced ale.
- 15 Boxing Day, 26th December, is the feast day of this first Christian martyr or protomartyr.
- 16 The other name for Holy Innocents' Day on 28th December.
- 17 The other name for Twelfth Night.
