- 1 The Latin or Greek name for Easter.
- 2 The name for the short and final period of Christ's life.
- 3 The official name for the three main days of Easter.
- 4 Easter is a feast, meaning that it doesn't fall on a fixed date.
- 5 This day commemorates the Last Supper and Jesus washing the feet of his apostles.
- 6 The first day of Holy Week.
- 7 The ceremony of to the cross took place on Good Friday.
- 8 The Easter was traditionally prepared on Good Friday, representing Christ's tomb.
- 9 Spiced buns traditionally eaten on Good Friday.

- 10 Meat is not traditionally eaten on Good Friday and many people replace it with this.
- 11 This Easter treat is historically associated with Mothering Sunday, but is now associated with Easter.
- 12 Lent is days.
- 13 The number of the Stations of the Cross, or the Way of Sorrows, that depict Christ's final day on Earth as a man.
- 14 Some suggest that this famous Reformer organised Easter egg hunts for his congregation in the 16th century.
- 15 The meat traditionally roasted and eaten on Easter Sunday.

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
