
July martyrs, saints and feast days

- 4 This Anne was burned for heresy on 16 July 1546.
- 5 Reformers John Frith and Andrew Hewet were burned for heresy here on 4 July 1533.
- 7 This saint and former Tudor Lord Chancellor was beheaded on 6 July 1535.
- 8 The northern city where Catholic martyrs William Anlaby, Thomas Warcop and Edward Fulthrop were executed on 4 July 1597.
- 10 Julins Palmer, John Gwyn, and Thomas Robyns were burned for sedition and heresy on 16 July 1556 and are known as the Martyrs.
- 12 This saint and apostle, and patron saint of Spain, has his feast day on 25 July.
- 14 Catholic priest and martyr Beesley was executed on 1 July 1591.
- 16 2 July is the Feast of the of the Virgin.
- 17 The profession of John Copping who was executed on 5 July 1583 for dispersing "sundry seditious, schismatical and erroneous printed books".

18 Catholic priest and martyr John Boste was hanged, drawn and quartered in this northern city on 24 July 1594 after being accused of leaving and re-entering England without permission.
