
Tudor Williams

- 8 This William was groom of the stool to Henry VIII and died of sweating sickness in 1528.
- 13 This William was Archbishop of Canterbury and godfather to Henry, Duke of Cornwall, son of Henry VIII and Catherine of Aragon.
- 14 This William was a spelling reformer and grammarian.
- 15 This William served as a secretary to Elizabeth I and was imprisoned after Mary Queen of Scots' death warrant was sent without the queen's permission.
- 17 This William's mother was Mary Arden and his wife was Anne Hathaway.
- 18 This William was second husband to Bess of Hardwick.
- 19 This William was a Bible translator.

- 1 This Wiliam was the son-in-law of Sir Thomas More and author of a biography of More.
- 2 This William preached in front of Henry

VIII and was recorded as saying that dogs would lick his blood, as they had done to Ahab.

- 4 This William was a nephew of Sir Thomas More and worked with Nicholas Harpsfield and John Clement on publishing a volume of More's works.
- 5 This William was Elizabeth I's Secretary of State.
- 6 This William was executed in May 1536 for treason in the fall of Anne Boleyn.
- 7 This William was the son of a prominent duke, was Baron of Effingham and a naval commander.
- 9 This William sided with Henry Tudor at the Battle of Bosworth but was executed in 1495 for allegedly supporting Perkin Warbeck.
- 10 This William was nicknamed William Waste All by his family historian and fought in the Battle of Nibley Green.
- 11 This William escaped execution for his part in Wyatt's Rebellion by fleeing to France.
- 12 This William introduced the "x" symbol for multiplication and the abbreviations "sin" and "cos" for the sine and cosine functions.
- 16 This William was Mary Boleyn's first husband.
