- 1 This bird could be eaten on fish days because it was thought that its young hatched from these crustaceans.
- 2 The grilled tail of this mammal could be eaten because its excellent swimming meant that it must be a fish.
- 3 The dolphin and this aquatic mammal were viewed as fish.
- 4 This sea bird counted as fish because of its aquatic habitat.
- 5 This eel-like fish was a popular delicacy during Lent.
- 6 Fish was often preserved by it.
- 7 A semi-aquatic mammal that was viewed as fish and so could be eaten.
- 8 This fatty fish was popular during Lent and could be dried and smoked, or pickled.
- 9 This predatory fish could keep populations of other fish in ponds down and could be cooked and eaten.
- 10 This freshwater fish was apparently best boiled in wine, but could also be baked in dough.
- 11 These now prized mollusks were enjoyed by the coastal lower classes.
- 12 Another aquatic mammal that could be served boiled or roasted.
- 13 This fish was deemed a royal fish and was cooked by boiling.
- 14 These freshwater crustaceans were popular on fish days.

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
