
Tudor women writers and poets

- 3 This daughter of poet Robert Sidney was an English Renaissance poet. She wrote the 1621 The Countess of Montgomery's Urania.
- 6 This lady's married names were Russell and Hoby and she was known for her musical and poetical talents.
- 7 This daughter of Sir Thomas More's works included a translation of Erasmus' "Precatio Dominica" as "A Devout Treatise upon the Paternoster".
- 8 The writings of this Tudor woman, who was executed in 1554, were collected and published by John Foxe.
- 9 The full name (before marriage) of Sir Francis Bacon's mother, who translated Bishop John Jewel's "Apologie of the Anglican Church".
- 10 This 16th century Scottish lady wrote sonnets, such as an ode to her first husband, while she was imprisoned.
- 12 Which Tudor woman wrote the poem "On Monsieur's Departure"?

- 13 This Tudor woman had two poetical brothers, was a patron of poets and was also praised for her own poetry.
- 14 Catherine Parr published two works. The first was "Prayers or Meditations" but what was the second?

- 2 Isabella is known as the first Englishwoman believed to have written original secular poetry for publication.

- 5 This lady was a patron of education and translated works such as Thomas a Kempis' Imitation of Christ.
- 11 This Protestant martyr wrote ballads during her imprisonment.
