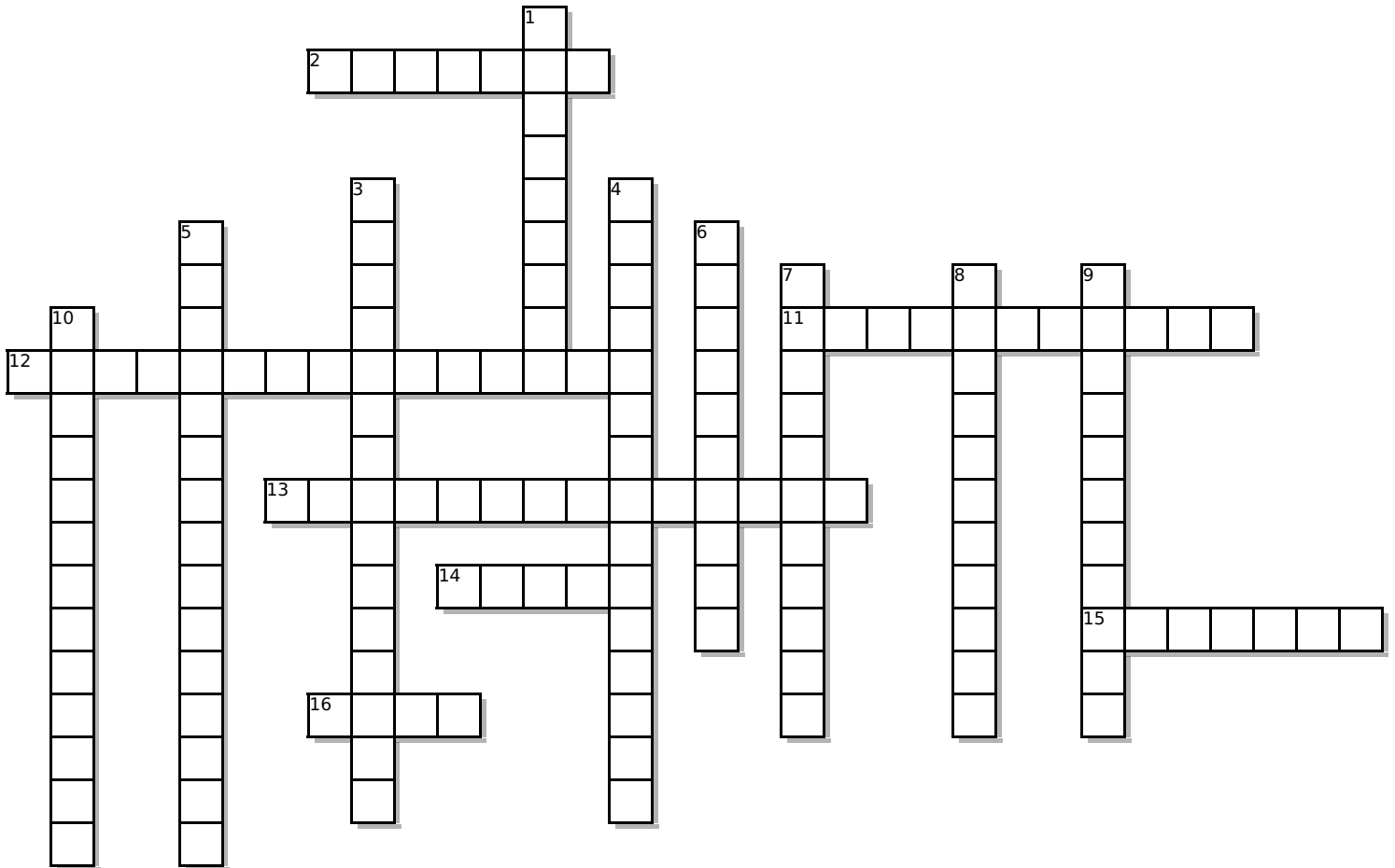


The Places and People of July 1553

- 2 On hearing of her brother's illness and a possible plot against her, Mary fled from this place.
- 11 This goldsmith informed Mary of Edward VI's death.
- 12 Who wrote "Vita Mariae Angliae Reginae" which gave a detailed account of the events of July 1553?
- 13 This Bishop of London preached in London denouncing Mary and Elizabeth as "bastards" on 9th July.
- 14 The Earl of Pembroke, in persuading the royal council to change sides to Mary, said "this shall make Mary queen, or I will die in her quarrel."
- 15 The Earls of Pembroke and persuaded the royal council to betray Queen Jane and change to Mary's side.
- 16 A boy had his cut off after declaring that Mary was the rightful queen.

- 1 This royal secretary, on 10th July, replied to Mary's letter rejecting her claim to the throne.
- 3 King Edward VI died here on 6th July 1553.
- 4 This man was Lady Jane Grey's husband.
- 5 This man visited royal ships off the East Anglian coast and persuaded the crews to turn to Mary's side.
- 6 This man informed Lady Jane Grey of Edward's death and his wishes.
- 7 To whose male heirs did Edward VI decide to succeed him before he named Lady Jane Grey as his heir?
- 8 Mary was at her estate here when she was officially proclaimed queen in London on 19th July.
- 9 Mary gathered her household here on 8th July and they proclaimed her queen.
- 10 Lady Jane Grey was welcomed to this place as queen on 10th July 1553.
