- 1 The rebellion took place in the of England.
- 2 A vicar preached a sermon at a church here on 1st October 1536 affirming that the Church and its faith were in danger.
- 3 Trouble, including murder, broke out in this Lincolnshire town on 4th October 1536.
- 4 On 7th October 1536, rebels met at this cathedral.
- 5 This lawyer became the leader of the "commons", i.e. the rebels.
- 6 On 19th October 1536, Henry VIII wrote to this duke ordering him to "destroy, burn and kill man, woman and child" as an example to others.
- 7 This castle yield to the rebels on 20th October 1536.

- 8 The owner of the castle that yielded to the rebels.
- 9 Four chaplains of were appointed by the rebels on 25th October 1536.
- 10 In November 1536, this duke offered the rebels promises from the king and a deal was struck.
- 11 A further rebellion led by this man in January 1537 led to former Pilgrimage of Grace rebels leaders being executed.
- 12 The rebel banner displayed the Holy of Christ.
- 13 This Chief Butler of England was implicated in the rebellion and executed.
- 14 Sir Percy was convicted of treason and executed for his part in the rebellion.

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
