


Six Wives Places



ACROSS

- 3 The Wiltshire seat of Jane Seymour's family
- 11 Catherine Parr is thought to have stayed with relatives here after the death of her first husband
- 12 Jane Seymour died here in October 1537
- 13 Courtier Nicholas Poyntz added a wing to this property for the visit of Henry VIII and Anne Boleyn in 1535
- 14 Catherine Parr spent some of her childhood at this Hertfordshire property
- 15 Jane Seymour's resting place is in the chapel of this property
- 16 Catherine of Aragon spent her final two years in Spain at this Andalucían complex of palaces and gardens

DOWN

- 1 Anne of Cleves died at this former home of Catherine Parr in July 1557
- 2 During her time with her step-grandmother,

Catherine Howard split her time between Norfolk House in Lambeth and this property near Horsham

- 4 The childhood home of Anne Boleyn
- 5 Catherine of Aragon was born in the Archbishop's Palace at this place
- 6 This Lincolnshire property served as home to Catherine Parr after her first marriage and was visited by Henry VIII and Catherine Howard on their 1541 progress
- 7 Catherine Howard was confined here before being taken to the Tower of London in 1542
- 8 Catherine of Aragon died here in January 1536
- 9 Henry VIII disguised himself to meet Anne of Cleves for the first time here on 1st January 1540
- 10 This castle in Solingen, Germany, was home to Anne of Cleves in her early years
- 13 While she was serving Queen Claude of France, Anne Boleyn spent time at the Loire Valley châteaux of Blois and
