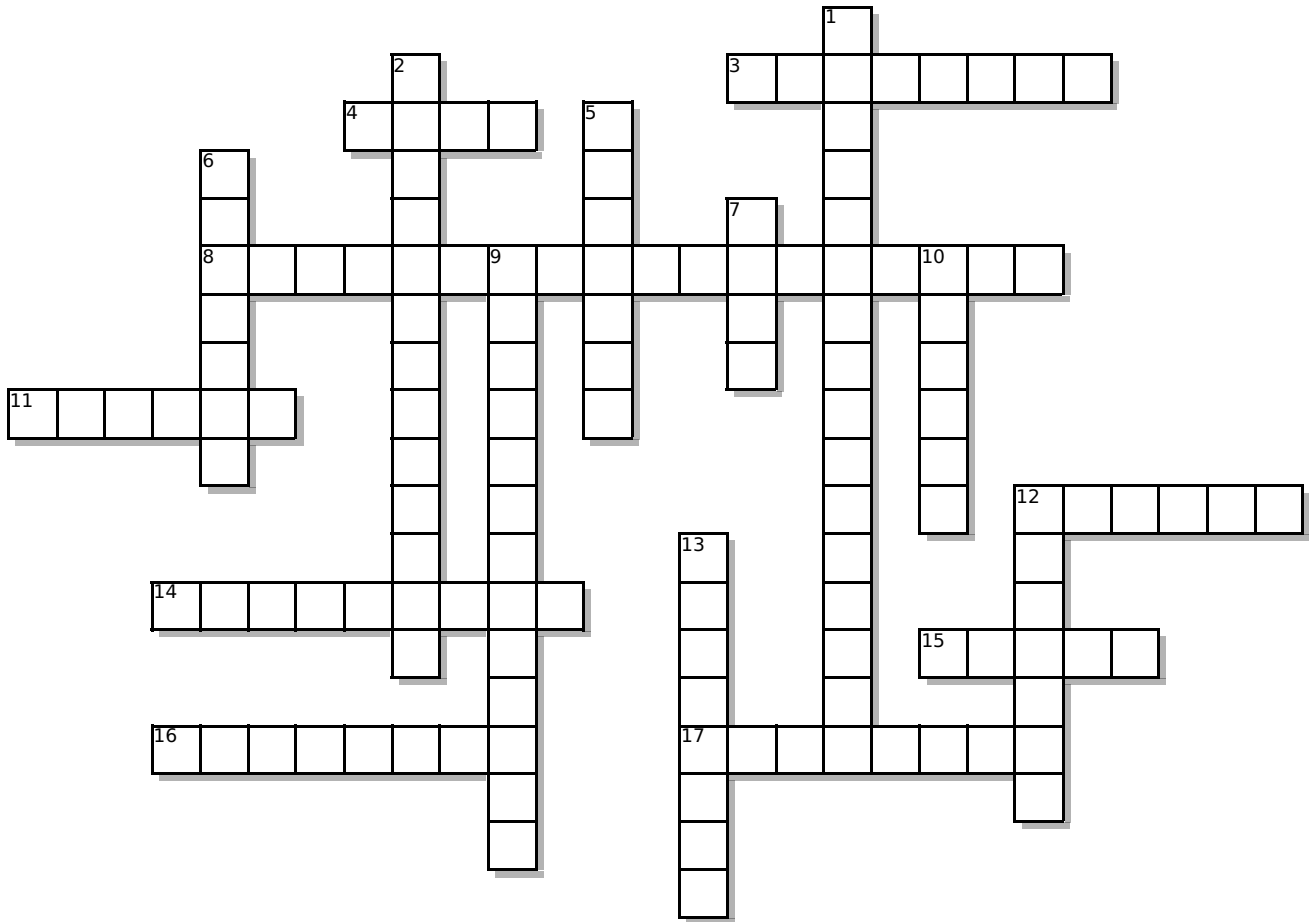


Kings of England



ACROSS

- 3 This king was executed for high treason in 1649.
- 4 This king was known as "Lackland" due to the fact that his father, Henry II, did not promise him any territory.
- 8 This 11th century king built Westminster Abbey and was canonised.
- 11 This 9th century king was the first king to call himself King of the Anglo-Saxons, or English.
- 14 King Henry V is known for his defeat of the French at this battle in 1415.
- 15 The number of Tudor kings.
- 16 This "conqueror" king was also known as "the Bastard", being the illegitimate son of Robert I, Duke of Normandy.
- 17 This crusading king was known as the Coeur de Lion.

- 1 This battle in 1485 saw the start of the

Tudor dynasty with Henry Tudor's victory.

- 2 Henry VI died here after being deposed and imprisoned by Edward IV.
- 5 This king was forced to abdicate in favour of his daughter and her husband in the Glorious Revolution.
- 6 This nephew of Henry I seized the throne while his cousin, Henry's daughter, Matilda, was away from England.
- 7 According to legend, this 11th century king attempted to stop the incoming tide by command.
- 9 Richard III became king after this Act of Parliament deemed the previous king and his brother illegitimate and their claims to the throne invalid.
- 10 Elizabeth I's death in 1603 saw the end of the Tudors and the House of uniting the English and Scottish crowns under King James I (VI of Scotland).
- 12 This king was born at Bolingbroke Castle. He became king after deposing King Richard II.
- 13 This king was married to Isabella of France and is known for the English defeat of Robert the Bruce at the Battle of Bannockburn in 1314.
