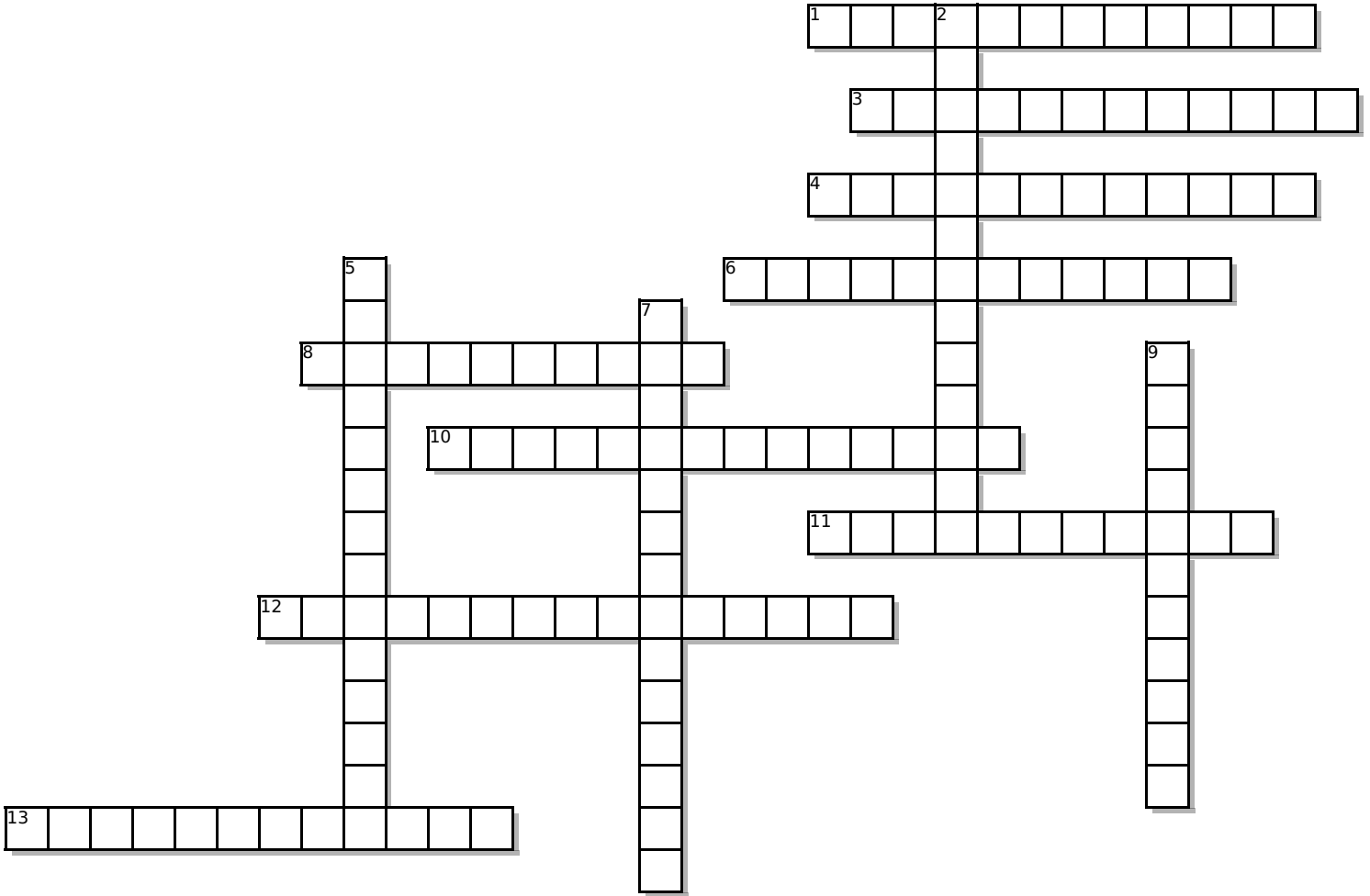


Tudor Bad Boys



ACROSS

- 10 This duke married, abandoned his first wife, married her aunt, returned to his first wife and then married the king's sister in secret.
- 11 This man led a gang that murdered his wife's private secretary and ended up being murdered in 1567.

- 12 This man implicated in Anne Boleyn's fall had a dubious reputation, having been involved in a man being hanged and in bribery and corruption.

- 13 This one-eyed courtier was nicknamed the Vicar of Hell and slept with a courtesan at the papal court to gain intelligence.

- 2 This Tudor man was alleged to have made a kidnap attempt on Edward VI and his behaviour with the adolescent Elizabeth I is now seen as sexual abuse.
- 5 This member of Henry VIII's privy chamber may have been involved in a rape and murder before having a relationship with the queen.

- 9 This baron was involved in bringing down Bishop Fisher and Sir Thomas More, as well as the illegal torture of Anne Askew.
