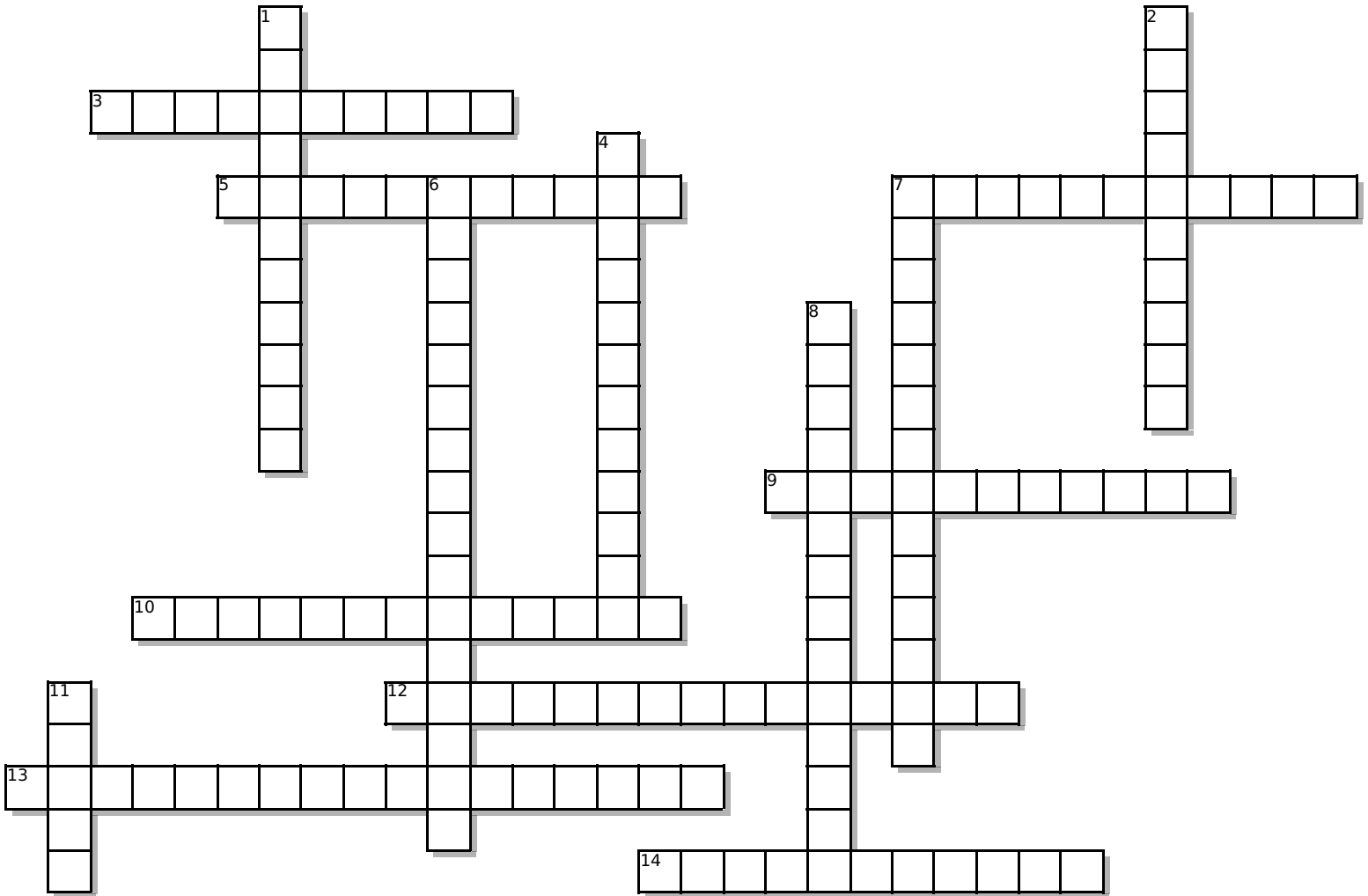


Tudor Murders and Murderers



ACROSS

- 3 This wife of Robert Dudley was found dead in 1560 and it was rumoured that her husband had arranged her murder.
- 5 This secretary to Mary, Queen of Scots, was stabbed to death by men led by Lord Darnley in March 1566.
- 7 This man, executed in 1502 for treason, was alleged to have confessed to murdering the Prince in the Tower,
- 9 This Scottish cardinal was murdered by a group of Fife lairds in 1546.
- 10 This Baron Dacre was hanged at Tyburn in 1541 for murdering a servant while poaching on another man's estate.
- 12 This Tudor lady was hanged in 1523 with her servant for the murder of her first husband, John Cotell.
- 13 The chancellor to the Bishop of Lincoln and one of Thomas Cromwell's men were murdered in October 1536 by a mob at the start of this rebellion.
- 14 This husband of Mary, Queen of Scots, was murdered in February 1567.

DOWN

- 1 This man, whose murder inspired an Elizabethan play, was killed in 1551 by his wife, her lover and conspirators, after several botched attempts.
- 2 This 8th Earl of Northumberland was found dead at the Tower in June 1585 from a gunshot wound. His death was ruled suicide, but three shots to the chest point to murder.
- 4 This merchant tailor and leading member of the Lollard community in London was found hanged in his prison at the Tower of London on 4th December 1514. It is thought that he was actually murdered.
- 6 This mercer and Member of Parliament was shot to death in 1536, the first person in England to be killed by a handgun.
- 7 This Scottish lady was executed by the "Maiden", a type of guillotine, in 1600 for asking her servant to murder her husband.
- 8 Henry Howard, Earl of Northampton, was implicated in the poisoning of this man, who died in the Tower of London in 1613.
- 11 This French duke was wounded by a Huguenot assassin at the Siege of Orléans in 1563 and died a few days later,
