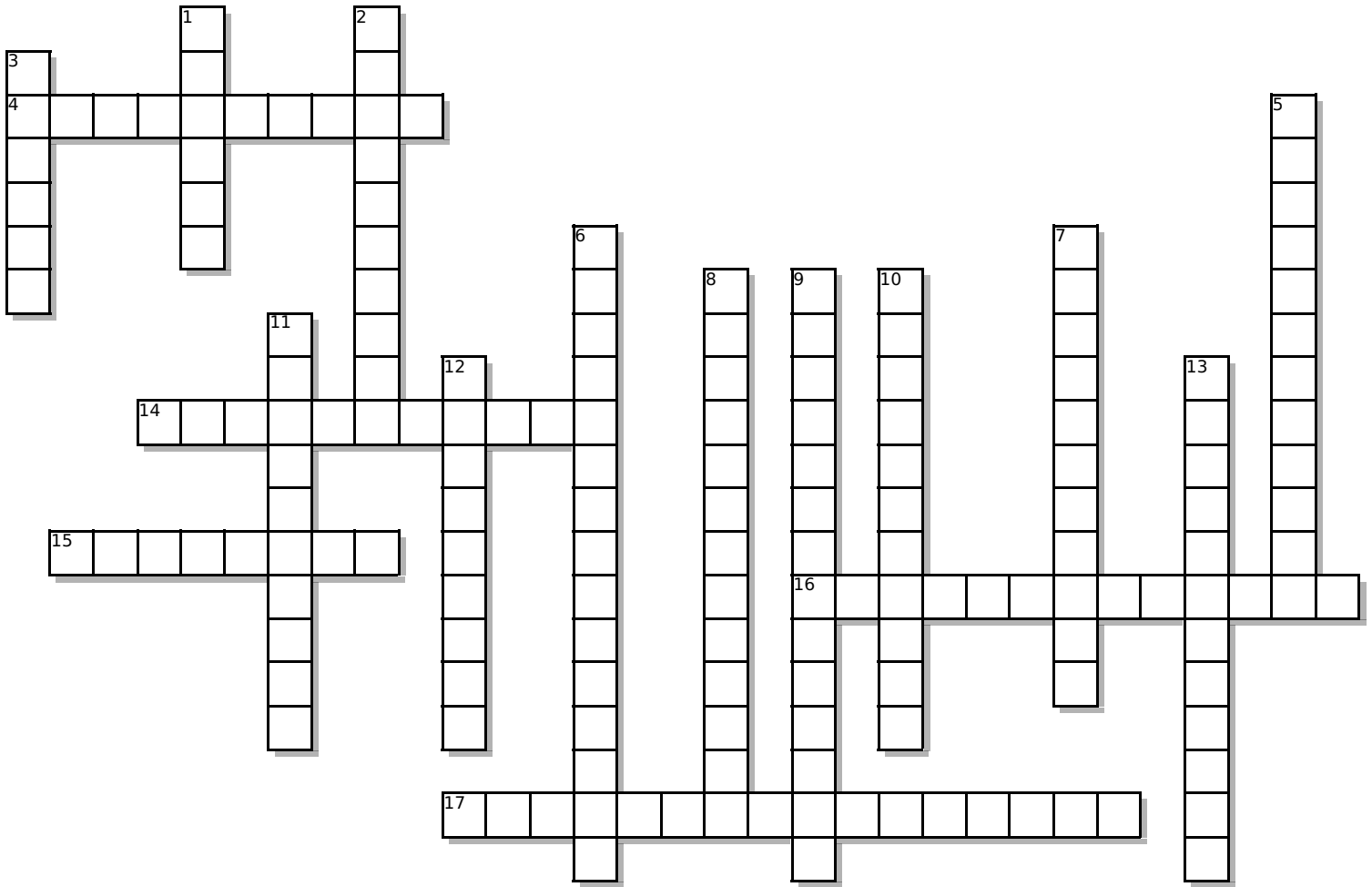

- 11 According to the story, the Ninety-Five Theses were pinned on the door of a church in this town.
- 12 The Act of recognised Henry VIII as the Supreme Head of the Church in England.
- 13 The publication of the Ninety-Five Theses by this Reformer is often regarded as the start of the Reformation.
