
Thomas Seymour

- 4 In 1545, Seymour was awarded for his military service with Hampton Place, which he renamed
- 8 This servant of Henry VIII's daughter, Elizabeth, claimed that Seymour had behaved inappropriately with her charge in 1547 and 1548.
- 11 Thomas Seymour's seat in Gloucestershire.
- 15 In 1543, before she married the king, Seymour courted Catherine Parr, whose husband, Baron, had just died.
- 16 While his brother, Edward Seymour, became Lord Protector, Seymour was given this office in February 1547.
- 17 Seymour's resting place.

DOWN

- 1 Seymour's wife gave birth to a daughter called on 30th August 1548.
- 2 In February 1547, Seymour was ennobled

- and given this title.
- 3 This girl became Seymour's ward and lived with him and his wife, Catherine Parr in 1547 and 1548.
- 5 Thomas Seymour and his siblings were brought up at this property, the Seymour family home.
- 6 In his dying days, King Henry VIII appointed Seymour to this.
- 7 In 1538 and again in 1546, this woman was put forward as a potential marriage match for Thomas Seymour.
- 9 Seymour was charged withcounts of treason in 1549.
- 10 Seymour was beheaded here on 20th March 1549.
- 12 Seymour was elected to this Order in 1547.
- 13 In 1549, Seymour was found guilty of high treason by a bill of for conspiring against his brother, the Lord Protector, among other things.
- 14 Seymour led the Marquess of Dorset to believe that he could arrange a marriage between his daughter and this person.
